Section Four: Award Selection Criteria

The commission shall consider the following criteria, as each may be applicable, in determining selection for the Mayor's Awards for Historic Preservation:

- Property must be located in the City of Aurora.
- Building must have been constructed at least 50 years ago or designated as historic by the City of Aurora.
- Only exterior projects will be considered.
- Project must have been completed within in the previous calendar year.
- The impact a preservation, maintenance or restoration project has on preserving and enhancing the architectural integrity of a structure.
- The impact a project has on contributing to the historical integrity of a neighborhood.
- The use of unique materials or rehabilitation techniques.
- The reproduction/restoration of significant architectural features.
- Features, spaces, and spatial relationships that characterize a property was retained.
- Distinctive materials, features, finishes, and construction techniques or examples of craftsmanship that characterize a property shall be preserved.
- Original materials were retained (example: slate roof repair/replacement, removal of artificial siding, repair/restoration of wood siding).
- Historic materials and features were repaired rather than replaced.
- When material was replaced, the new matches the old in composition, design, color and texture.
- Landscape and site features original to the site were preserved.
