ORDINANCE NO. 020-013
DATE OF PASSAGE February 11, 2020

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 27-176, Parking Commercial Vehicles, Trailers, and Truck Tractors in residential districts.

WHEREAS, the City of Aurora has a population of more than 25,000 persons and is, therefore, a home rule unit under subsection (a) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, subject to said Section, a home rule unit may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs for the protection of the public health, safety, morals, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of its home rule powers, it is necessary and desirable for the City of Aurora to amend its ordinance regarding parking of commercial vehicles, trailers, and truck tractors in residential neighborhoods

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Aurora, Illinois, as follows:

Section One: That the amendment to Chapter 27, Section 176, are hereby adopted as set forth in said "Exhibit A."

Section Two: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect, and shall be controlling, upon its passage and approval.

Section Three: That all Ordinances or part of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed insofar any conflict exists.

Section Four: That any section, phrase or paragraph of this Ordinance that is construed to be invalid, void or unconstitutional shall not affect the remaining sections, phrases or paragraphs of this Ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.





1 Sec. 27-176. - Parking commercial vehicles, trailers, truck tractors in residential districts.

2 ~~No commercial vehicle, trailer or truck tractor exceeding two (2) tons in weight, according to vehicle~~
3 ~~registration classification, shall be permitted to be parked on any public street in a residence district for a~~
4 ~~longer period than two (2) hours. Vehicles that violate this section for six (6) or more consecutive hours~~
5 ~~shall be subject to towing by order of the police department.~~

8 No commercial vehicle or truck tractor, with or without a trailer, exceeding two (2) tons in weight,
9 according to vehicle registration, or any type of trailer, regardless of if the trailer or semi-trailer is attached
10 to another vehicle shall be permitted to park on any public street in a residential district:

- 11 (a) ~~is prohibited from parking~~ between the hours of 10 p.m. to 7 a.m.; or
12 (b) for a period longer than two hours between the hours of 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.; or
13 (c) in a manner to obstruct other vehicular traffic or cause a hazard.

14 For the purposes of this section, trailer is defined as: Every vehicle without motive power in operation,
15 designed for carrying persons or property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle ~~and so constructed that~~
16 ~~no part of its weight rests upon the towing vehicle~~ including but not limited to travel trailers, watercraft
17 trailers, utility trailers, travel trailers, truck campers, camping trailers, landscape trailers, and vehicle
18 transport trailers.

19 Vehicles in violation of this section shall be subject to towing by order of the police department.
